

ORDINANCE NUMBER 608

ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE
CITY OF CARLISLE, IOWA, 2000, BY AMENDING PROVISIONS OF CHAPTER 111,
ELECTRIC UTILITY

BE IT ENACTED, by the City Council of the City of Carlisle, Iowa:

SECTION 1. Chapter 111.05 sections 1 through 3 & 6 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Carlisle, Iowa, 2000, are hereby repealed and the following adopted in lieu thereof:

1. Definition of Summer and Winter rates. Summer rates shall be billed in June, July, August and September. Winter rates shall be billed in October, November, December, January, February, March, April and May.

All rates and the bills for services rendered there under may be adjusted from month to month to reflect base costs of "Power Production Cost Adjustment" or "Energy Cost Adjustment" or any other similar costs charged to the City by its power supplier.

All rates may be increased by the amount of any new or increased governmental tax imposed and levied on production, transmission, distribution for sale of electricity or other cost variation that is in excess of 10% of the expense included in the rate base for power and transmission costs and the City Council believes is in the best interest of the Utility to include in a 12-month adjustment clause.

2. A. Residential Rates. Monthly charges for electric service for single occupancy residential consumption shall be;

2. B. Residential Electric Heat Rates: When an electric space heating rate has been applied for and electric space heating has been installed which conforms to the utility's specifications and is the sole source of heat for the premises, monthly charges shall be;

3. A. General Service (previous Commercial) Rates: Monthly charges for electric service for commercial consumption shall be;

3. B. General Service Heat (previous Commercial Electric Heat) Rates: When an electric space heating rate has been applied for and electric space heating has been installed which conforms to the utility's specifications and is the sole source of heat for the premises, monthly charges shall be;

3. C. General Service Demand (previous Commercial Demand Metered) Rates: For any customer whose normal total demand is 40 KW or more, provided the entire requirements are taken through one meter, not applicable to resale, standby, temporary, supplemental, auxiliary or shared service, the monthly charges shall be;

Beginning March 1, 2010:

3. D. Security Lighting (Dusk to Dawn Lighting) Rates: To any Customer to light an area of an existing meter service location agreeable to the Electric Utility, for which Utility lamps with photocell dusk-to-dawn control will be installed on Utility owned poles.

The monthly charges shall be;

3. E. Street Lighting Rate (new): To any governmental agency to light streets, highways, or other public right-of-ways where the energy is delivered from metered service under the applicable General Service Rate, for which Utility lamps with photocell dusk-to-dawn control are installed on Utility owned poles. The monthly charges for maintenance of such light fixtures shall be;

Beginning March 1, 2010:

SECTION 2. Repealer: All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. Severability Clause: If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudicated invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 4. When Effective: This ordinance shall be in effect from, and after, its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law and the rates herein shall be effective for all bills rendered beginning March 1, 2010 (typically for electric usage during the previous month's meter reading period.
